#### SECOND SESSION OF THE NINETEENTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

## May 31, 2021

The Assembly commenced sitting at 1:30 pm, with the Honourable Frederick Blake Jr., Speaker, presiding.

The Assembly observed a moment of silence in remembrance of the 215 Indigenous children who died at the Kamloops Indian Residential School.
